

Registration Fees

Hotel Registration

The 2017 reunion will be held at the Hotel Elegante', Colorado Springs, CO. The discounted group room rates are also offered for the three days prior, and three days after the reunion. Room rates are \$109.00 per night (plus taxes), which includes a breakfast buffet, or a plated breakfast (including eggs, meat, potatoes, toast, coffee and juice) per guest, each day. Breakfast tickets provided during your hotel check-in—please make sure you receive enough breakfast tickets for your entire stay.

NOTE: This breakfast perk is for our 6918th guests registered at the Hotel Elegante' only!
